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The Gender Clinic at The Barbara Bush Children's Hospital: Patient Referral Information, Demographics, and Goals

Introduction

Program evaluation to better understand patients referred to The Gender Clinic.

Methods

Retrospective chart review- all new referrals over a 12 mos. period, from June 1, 2020 to May 31,2021. During this period, the program accepted referrals up to age 26. Each chart was reviewed for an 8 month period.

Patients referred to The Gender Clinic are complex, with many psychosocial, mental health, and medical treatment goals.

Discussion

Patients referred to The Gender Clinic are complex and present with many psychosocial, mental health, and medical goals, requiring individualized treatment planning. Almost 60% of patients referred were not seen within 8 months of the initial referral. Further information is needed to understand why. Not all patients who presented with initial medical treatment goals had a medical appointment to initiate treatment. Those who did not initiate treatment may have been participating in family therapy or identity exploration. It is unknown how many patients who identified medical treatment as an initial goal ultimately began this treatment.







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Findings

Newly referred patients were 15.9 years old (range 4.73-25.7).

Assigned Female patients are referred at **3x** the rate of Assigned Male patients.

A third of patients identify as non-binary.

Of the **304** unique patients referred, **175** attended a mental health evaluation and **82** had a medical appointment.

Of the **121** patients who identified GAHT as a treatment goal, less than a **quarter** (27) had a medical appointment to initiate treatment.

Of the 175 patients evaluated, 45% endorsed a trauma history.

The **top 4** reported mental health conditions were:

- Anxiety 76%
- Depression 70%
- ADHD 31%
- Autism 19%
