This is National Poison Prevention Week. Every day the Northern New England Poison Center, a department of Maine Medical Center, helps people across Maine, New Hamp-

shire and Vermont, providing quick, expert treatment advice to people at home, school and work, as well as in-depth consultations to health care providers.

The best way to be prepared for a poison emer-

gency is to have the poison center number handy:

- Store 1-800-222-1222 in your contacts on your phone. You also can text 85511.
- Order a magnet to put on your refrigerator. Call 1-800-222-1222, chat online at nnepc.org or email nnepc@mmc.org.

Poison Center is staffed with specially trained nurses and pharmacists 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

People call with questions about everything from medication errors to whether a plant in their home is poisonous to them or their pets.
