### 3 things you need to know about Palliative Medicine at MMC

- 1. Palliative Medicine provides patient- and family-centered care that optimizes quality of life by anticipating, preventing and treating suffering. Palliative 2. care throughout the continuum of illness involves addressing physical, intellectual, emotional, social and spiritual needs and facilitates patient autonomy, access to information and choice. The Palliative Medicine team is
- comprised of specialty physicians, advanced practice practitioners, social workers, chaplains and clinical ethicists.
- 2. Palliative care can be provided during any part of a patient's illness and can be alongside curative intent. The palliative care 3. team will work closely with the patient's primary physician and other specialists involved in
- the care. The team helps patients and their families navigate through the complexity of serious illness by focusing on their hopes, beliefs and personal goals. The team also provides continuity during transitions of care and long-term follow up.
- 3. Palliative care is provided to patients of any age from pediatrics to geriatric. MMC has a Pediatric Ad-

vanced Care Team (PACT) that serves children from birth through young adulthood. The PACT also works closely with the prenatal care team. The PACT includes a physician, a nurse practitioner and a social worker specialized in pediatric palliative care. The team collaborate closely with child life specialists, pediatric spiritual care and the patient's medical team.
