MMC OpEx teams invited to present at IHI National Forum

Ten MMC Operational Excellence teams will present their successes at the 29th Annual Institute of Healthcare Improvement (IHI) National Forum on Dec. 12 and 13 in Orlando, Fla. This is the first year that the IHI accepted every MMC team that applied to share its storyboard outlining successful improvements in patient care.

The storyboards show that small changes can lead to significant outcomes.

For instance, in October 2016, clinical staff on P6 committed to reducing the number of falls on the inpatient psychiatric unit. The solution was to outfit patients who were deemed to be at very high risk for falls with a yellow shirt and a vellow bracelet. The change made those patients easy to identify, and staff members were able to keep closer watch over them.

As a result of this KPI and the improvement steps taken, there was a marked

decrease in the number of falls in that unit.


