CNA Program Graduates Accept Jobs at MMC

On March 27, Maine Medical Center's Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) program honored 28 graduates from the 11-week session that began in January. This is MMC's 52nd class since it began offering the program in partnership with Portland Adult Education in 2000. Please welcome these new graduates, as most have accepted CNA positions throughout the hospital.

CNAs are caregivers who provide patients assistance with activities of daily living and basic needs. They also help patients feel safe and comfortable throughout their hospital stay. These direct caregivers spend most of their time assisting patients and listening to

their concerns.

Maine Medical Center offers a CNA training course sponsored by MMC's Center for Clinical and Professional Development and Portland Adult Education. The course, offered in January, March and September, includes classroom work, skills labs and clinical experience. The course is an 11week, daytime course of 180 hours. MMC covers the cost of the course. At the end of the course, the students take the State Certification Examination.

More than 1,200 students have now taken part in our CNA program since its inception. A mandatory information session for our fall
