#### New Parking Program Enhances Patient Experience

Recent parking enhancements at MMC are improving the patient experience. Attendants began staffing the South Lot, at the corner of Bramhall and Chadwick Streets, on November 1, and the changes were immediately noticeable; there was a decrease in morning traffic and no wait time for parking.

Parking Services recently restriped the lot to create 70 additional spots, and attendants guide drivers toward available spots. In addition, attendants help with valet assist – or "stacked"

parking – where cars may be lined up in rows of three. The attendants hold on to visitors' keys to be able to move the cars as needed. There is no cost to visitors as a result of these changes.

"Valet parking allows us to enhance the first and last impression that patients and their family members may experience," says Helena Ackerson, MPPM, Director of Patient Experience. "MMC is clearly patient centered, and it's exciting to see these new programs Welcome
