New Surgical Center Brings Enhanced Service Offerings, Expanded Space In a Modern Design


Surgery 2, MMC's new surgical center, opens on October 19. The building boasts five operating rooms, 20 pre- and postoperative spaces, and bright, comfortable waiting areas to accommodate people waiting for loved ones to come out of surgery.

The facility is a direct reflection of our commitment to improve outcomes by providing the safest care for our patients. MMC is now better equipped to provide the right procedure at the right time and get patients back to living their lives as healthily and quickly as possible. Just as important, our enhanced service offerings provide area residents a local option for even more best-in-class care and treatment.

"MMC is committed to achieving our vision of making Maine the healthiest state in the nation," says Jeff Sanders, Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. "This project moves us closer to that goal."

The hospital performs approximately one-third of all inpatient surgeries in the state and 45 percent of interventional cardiology procedures. Expanded spaces – allowing for more staff and more technology in the rooms – combined with modern design, helps us meet demands for both routine and complex procedures.

how we are doing the shifts, MMC's Master Facilities how we are going to get patients in and out, and how we are dealing with the equipment," says Robert Ecker, M.D., Director of Neurosurgery.

Plan, Surgery 2 will have significant short- and longterm benefits for the medical center and its patients. The hospital's operating rooms were running at a utilization rate of up to 94 percent, which is substantially higher than industry standards.
