Policy Establishes Friday as Official MMC Pay Day, Effective January 2014

Effective January 10, 2014, Maine Medical Center will implement a policy that establishes clarity across MaineHealth with regard to our official "pay day," while ensuring compliance with federal banking regulations.

Currently MMC employees expect to receive direct deposits or pay card postings sometime on either Thursday or Friday every other week. While this practice may not change the usual day on which your funds are deposited, it standardizes our relationships with financial institutions to guarantee pay by Friday.

"Employees' personal banking circumstances are unlikely to change unless their financial institutions decide to adjust their processing time as a result of this policy," says Jeffrey Winchenbach, Senior Director of Financial Services for MaineHealth, which currently processes payroll for more than 7,400 people, including all Maine Medical Center employees. "While this is primarily an administrative change, it is important that everyone is prepared as of the beginning of the New Year."

Winchenbach says employees should be aware of a couple of potential outcomes of this policy, which he says can be overcome with advanced planning:

• There may be a onetime, one-day delay in when you receive your pay during the first payroll of the New Year. For example, if your institution makes a change in processing time, an employee who is accustomed to receiving funds on Thursday would have to wait until Friday during the first pay period in January. From there, you can expect your deposit every other Friday.

Employees who have automatic withdrawals or transfers set up with their banks would need to make adjustments to ensure that funds are available (i.e.; to be on the

safe side, adjust your automatic withdrawals to occur on Friday).

As we continue our transition to a Shared Services model and share our Human Resources and Financial Services capabilities across the MaineHealth system, Winchenbach says it is important that we create consistent practices that help our employees to be

knowledgeable about their benefits. Here's how a standardized pay day helps MaineHealth entities:

- It provides additional • processing time, if needed — the pay delays from earlier this year would have been non-events if pay day was officially Friday.
 - It brings MaineHealth into compliance with established banking rules.

"If you surveyed all of our employees about when pay day falls, you'd get a couple of different answers, but the fact is that this is the first time we've put an official pay day on record," says Winchenbach. "When all MaineHealth institutions are under the Shared Services umbrella, we will be processing payroll for 17,000 employees across the state, so it is important that we take steps now to prepare."
