Lovett named AVP for Research

Edmund J. Lovett III, PhD, has been named Associate Vice President for Research at Maine Medical Center. He continues in his role as Director of Maine Medical Center Research Institute, a position he has held since 1987.

Dr. Lovett is a graduate of Norwich University in Northfield, Vermont, and the Univer-

sity of Connecticut Health Center in Farmington. His PhD is in Immunology and his graduate training included a postdoctoral fellowship in tumor immunology. He has held faculty positions in the Department of Sur-



gery at the UCONN Health Center and in the Department of Pathology at the University of Michigan.

Currently an Adjunct Professor of Immunology at the University of Southern Maine, Dr. Lovett has been Director of the Cytometry Program in MMC's Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, and was the founding Director and CEO of the Maine Cytometry Research Institute which merged with Maine Medical Center in 1991 when it was renamed the Maine Medical Center Research Institute. He continues to be a member of the Department of Pathology, as well as the Division of Immunology and Infectious Diseases and the Division of Hematology in the Department of Medicine. He is Director of MMC's Clinical Cytometry Laboratory and Associate Director



Volunteers needed for estrogen patch study

Healthy postmenopausal women are needed to test the effectiveness of a new estrogen patch. You may qualify if you are either:

 not taking estrogen and having five or more hot flashes or sweating episodes a day, or

• taking estrogen and have a history of frequent hot flashes or sweating episodes prior to medication.

Volunteers will wear a patch with estrogen or placebo for twelve weeks. Upon completion, volunteers will receive \$160. This study is being conducted by the Division of Endocrinology at Maine Medical Center. Call 774-4468 for more information.

Research volunteers needed for osteoporosis study

Healthy postmenopausal women aged 55 to 75 with 1 to 4 vertebral (spinal) fractures are needed for testoing an investigational therapy for osteoporosis. Qualified volunteers will receive investigational medication or placebo once every three months and bone density measurements and other evaluation every six months at no cost for a total of three years. Women needed for study

If you are a woman, age 18 or older, using a proven method of birth control and who may be experiencing symptoms of bacterial vaginitis (BV), you may be able to participate in a study.

Volunteers will receive \$75 for three clinic visits, full physical exams, blood work, and free medication. Medication is standard BV medication in a new convenient dosing. Symptoms of BV include feminine discharge, odor, or itching. Each clinic visit is about one hour or less and can be scheduled at your convenience. The study is sponsored by G.D.
