Diabetes Center at MMC celebrates first year

After a successful first year for the Diabetes Center at Maine Medical Center, its staff gathered to celebrate. They also honored Elton R. Blaisdell, M.D., (1894-1984) for his service to Maine Medical Center and his care of patients with diabetes. Norman Saunders, M.D., Louis Bove, M.D., and Georgette Carpenter, RN, shared memories of him.

A native of Aroostook County, Dr. Blaisdell graduated from Bowdoin Medical School and later established his practice in Portland. His interest in diabetes led him to study in Boston with Drs. Allen and Joslin; he was the first physician in Maine to treat diabetes with insulin. Dr. Blaisdell left a very generous bequest to assure the continuation of

The record-breaking success of the 1993 show was made possible through the efforts and support of hundreds of volunteers, corporations, and generous Telethon viewers. A highlight of the show was the presentation of funds raised through the balloon project at



quality medical education at Maine Medical Center.

At the celebration, Jackie Merrill, MS, RD, looked back at the Center's "roots." "Diabetes has always been one of my major interests," said Merrill. After participating in a workshop at the Joslin Clinic in Boston and visiting several Boston hospitals to study their outpatient nutrition services, Merrill returned with ideas for implementing a similar program at MMC.

Merrill recalled "As I provided nutrition education to our diabetic patients in the clinic in 1968 and 1969, it seemed that there were many educational needs for our inpatient and outpatient diabetic patients and for our staff that were not being met."

Merrill discussed the possibility of a coordinated inpatient and outpatient Group Diabetes Program with Dr. Saunders, Ed McGeachy, MMC's Associate Administrator at the time, and Eleanor Irish, MS, RN, who became director of the Outpatient Department in 1970. All three were enthused. In December 1970, Irish informed Merrill they could go ahead with the plans for the program; Georgette Carpenter, RN, would be the diabetes nurse educator and Merrill would provide the nutrition component.

At that time, Waterville's Thayer Hospital (now Mid Maine Medical Center) was the only other hospital in Maine offering group diabetes education. Merrill visited the Thayer program, investigated a program at EMMC that had been discontinued but provided valuable ideas, and made another trip to the Joslin Clinic.

April 5, 1971, marked the first week of diabetes classes. The program at MMC was the only one of its type in the state.

"Our diabetes classes were held weekly until 1992," said Merrill. "They were well attended and had excellent support from MMC's medical, nursing, and nutrition departments. The perception that our classes were successful and highly regarded can be attributed to the expertise and commitment of our diabetes nurse educator, Georgette Carpenter."

MMC also provided outreach programs for other sites beginning to develop diabetes education programs. Nursing homes, hospitals, the Institute for the Blind, and other sites had their personnel attend classes at MMC.

Having exposed the roots of today's Diabetes Center, Merrill remarked that the roots are "very strong and deep with our Diabetes Center thriving after a very successful first year of providing comprehensive diabetes care to a grateful community of diabetics and their families and a continuation of the diabetes classes that were begun 23 years ago."

Diabetes education continues at MMC. The Diabetes Center at Maine Medical Center provides educational programs for adults, children, and pregnant women with diabetes. Under the direction of John Devlin, M.D., a team of nurses, dietitians, and physicians works with primary care physicians to help their patients live well with their diabetes.
