The 0% Solution pays off in big way

Earlier this year, we reported on efforts by MMC's managers to trim their budgets. Challenged by a projected \$2 million deficit, they spent the winter taking a critical look at their staffing, supply and operating expenses. By the conclusion of the process in April, they had identified a staggering \$1.806 million in savings for this year.

It was a significant challenge to find that level of savings in an institution with a tradition of lean budgets. The bulk of the savings were the result of more agaressive purchasing, changes in proceres, or reductions in usage. Further savings came from changes in staffing patterns and levels.

Dubbed "The 0% Solution," the budget review process sought to reduce spending to the absolute minimum level necessary to provide services. The philosophy was to spend what was necessary, but no more.

Taking the positive approach— "spend 0% extra"—as opposed to the negative approach—"reduce spending by X%"—made it possible to make rational decisions. It recognized that some areas had greater opportunities for savings than others, and placed a strong emphasis on maintaining quality.

By carefully reassessing workloads and levels of services provided, managers were able to eliminate more than 21 positions and reclassify 15 more to lower grades. No employees were laid off or downgraded, because the savings will come from vacant positions that will not be filled, or positions that will be eliminated or downgraded when they become vacant.

Executive Vice President and Treasurer Don McDowell, who has overseen the budget review, says it places the hospital in a much better financial posi-BUDGET, page 2
