Help will be there if you need it

"Most of us do not anticipate having personal problems that warrant professional intervention but when such problems arise, the Employee Assistance Program can be a wonderful, confidential resource for employees." These are the words of Patty Langkopf,



manager of Maine Medical Center's new Employee Assistance Program. The program provides assistance to employees and their families for a wide variety of counseling needs that include: marital and family, financial, legal, drug and alcohol, stress, mental illness, and other concerns.

The primary function of Langkopf's office is to act as an assessment and referral service. An MMC employee, or his or her family member, meets with Langkopf to have a personal issue assessed. The program manager then recommends the appropriate treatment, such as counseling, and refers the employee or family member to a community agency or other suitable helper. The assessment is free of charge and confidential; no one will know of the employee's involvement in the program. If services result from a referral, the em-

own," says Langkopf, "is that a thorough assessment is provided and subsequent recommendations are finetuned to meet the needs of the individual employee. Additionally, all treatment providers used for the purpose of referrals will have been screened to assure that they are qualified to address the problem or problems at hand."

Langkopf has developed a referral network and resource library of community agencies, private practitioners, support groups, attorneys, and alcohol/chemical dependency treatment facilities. In evaluating the quality of referral resources, she looked at the qualifications of the staff, professionally and experientially; determined any specialty areas, such as adolescent or couples therapy; and considered location, fees, sliding fee scales, and length of time in practice.

Since arriving at MMC in early March, the program manager has been creating policies and guidelines, training supervisors in how Employee Assistance supplements their role, providing guidance in the effective use of the program, and setting forth its goals, as well as developing the referral network.

Informational sessions have been scheduled to give employees the opportunity to ask questions about the new program. All of them will take place in Novce Auditorium in the Dana Health Education Center. They will be offered on the following dates:
