
MMC hosts regional conference

On May 19, Maine Medical Center hosted a regional conference on Lactation Management for physicians, nurses, and nutritionists featuring internationally known speakers. This is one of ten similar conferences that will be offered nationwide during 1989. The goal of the conference is to provide training in the management of breastfeeding to health professionals in order to comply with the Surgeon General's 1990 Health Objective to increase the incidence and duration of breastfeeding in this country to 75 percent of all infants at hospital discharge and 35 percent at 6 months of age. Currently in Maine, 55 percent of infants are breastfed at hospital discharge.

The Department of Pediatrics at Maine Medical Center feels that the promotion of breastfeeding is an important public health issue in Maine. Richard Narkewicz, immediate past president of the American Academy of Pediatrics, spoke at the conference presenting the Academy's position in support of breastfeeding.

The conference was sponsored by the MMC Department of Pediatrics, the Maine Department of Human Services, and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.


