MMC Trustee receives award for leadership

MMC Trustee Roger Woodman, former president of Campbell, Payson and Noyes, has received the Henri A. Benoit Award for leadership in the private sector. He was one of three community leaders presented awards for community leadership by the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

Woodman is being recognized for his outstanding contribution to the Greater Portland community through his active leadership in civic activities. Nursing power is topic of conference

"In order to be successful you need to think, act, speak and look like a winner." That was the message given by keynote speaker Kit Stahler-Miller, RN, MSN, to an audience of 230 nurses at the conference "Professional Image: How Successful People Recognize Each Other," at Maine Medical Center last week.

Stahler-Miller, founder and president of the Philadelphia based image consulting firm Images in Transition, spoke on professional image and career development for nursing. How to translate the changes, choices and challenges facing nursing today into actions that positively influence one's career and the nursing profession were the topics of discussion.

"Power can be considered the ability to positively influence others," said Stahler-Miller. "Nurses can actively seek influence among people and be influential anytime in any setting. Personal power is the cornerstone of projecting a credible professional image. It is necessary to manage self before managing others.

"Professional image, risk-taking and networking can help nurses position themselves to achieve or create innovative and satisfying career opportunities in the dynamic and competitive marketplace of today. Image, risk-taking and

networking reflect credibility, power, and potential.

"You are your product," said Stahler-Miller. "Your image and behaviors are the basis for other's first impressions and recognition of you. Look inward to examine your personal and professional self-concept, look forward to consider your options, and reach upward to develop your personal and professional potential.

"To enhance image and empowerment of the nursing profession, nurses need to maximize their assets and minimize their limitations. And that's the bottom line."

The conference was presented by Staff Development in the Department of Nursing.
