Wynne appointed to BLS National Faculty

Nancy L. Wynne, RN, Education Coordinator for the Operating Room at Maine Medical Center, has been appointed a member of the American Heart Association's Basic Life Support National Faculty for a two year period.


As a member of the National Faculty, Wynne will act as the liaison between the Subcommittee on Emergency Cardiac Care and the Maine Affiliate ECC Committee. She will be responsible for assisting affiliates in the organization and implementation of training programs in BLS, integrating BLS courses into the curriculum of medical training institutions, and assisting in the development of local, state, or national emergency medical service systems.

Wynne has been an active member of the Affiliate Faculty for BLS for 13 years including four years as chairman. She is the co-founder and past chairman of the Portland CPR Task Force, a group of volunteers dedicated to providing CPR training to citizens. Wynne continues to coordinate local CPR courses, instructor courses, and recertifications in Cumberland County. She also teaches Instructor Training Recerts, BLS and Heartsaver courses regularly.

In honor of her leadership and dedication to the provision of high quality Basic Life Support services over the past 20 years, the 1988 CPR volunteer award has been named the Nancy Wynne CPR Volunteer Award.

Letters to Geoffrey help others cope

Life is a very precious gift, and sometimes a very fragile one. It was the birth of Geoffrey that helped Robert Webster, a pastor in Portland, and his wife Linda, understand the fragility of that gift. Geoffrey was born by an emergency Caesarean section 15 weeks premature and hospitalized in MMC's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit for several weeks.

Letters to Geoffrey, a father's letters to his premature son from birth to death, was written by Robert Webster. The book has been made available to hospitals nationwide in hopes of helping others cope with their baby's struggle for life.

Copies of the book are available in NICU, and from the lending library for bereaved parents. (call Connie Korda ext. 4226) Here are a few excerpts:

February 2 Dear Baby Geoff,

Welcome to this unsteady and frightening world. A nurse came to tell me we had a son who weighed 1 lb 5 oz. My first glimpse of you was very early this morning. I almost didn't want to see you. I knew the less I became attached to you the easier it would be to accept your death

You looked so tiny and frail, but so very normal, like a miniature baby. And you were so much alive, even with all the wires, tubes, machines and blinking numbers.

I touched you. I am overwhelmed by my feelings of you and the excitement of seeing you, my son, but I cannot hide my fear of what the future almost certainly holds for you and us.

February 10 Dear Geoff.

I'm really worried about you, little guy. You're not doing well with your feeding. They're going to wait awhile before they try again. You had a good night, even if you did have some trouble breathing and your vital signs are good. Waiting for phone calls to tell us how you are this morning is really hard.

The phone just rang. The nurse says you are doing pretty well, but you're still having trouble breathing. I cried when I hung up the phone. I guess it's a mixture of joy, relief and being scared.

Hang in there, Geoff! Keep fighting! Love Dad

February 13 My Dear Geoffrey,

I hope someday you will know how precious you are to me. I guess I've been guilty of taking birth and life for granted. Now that I stand so close to losing you, I realize what a precious gift life is.

You continue to amaze me. Every day has a little miracle in it, and I continue to ask for more.

March 7 Dear Geoffrey,

Well, my Son, your struggle is over and mine is just beginning. The doctor called and said you couldn't last much longer. We drove as fast as we could. Then Mommy and I stayed with you through your long, long night.

When you died I was holding you in my arms. You are free at last, but turning you loose is the hardest thing I've ever had to do, Geoff.

We left the hospital with a plastic bag that held your 'things'. . . the puppy block your sisters had given you, their school pictures, the little stuffed monkey and tiny pink teddy bear. There was a lucky penny a nurse taped to your isolette, your ID bracelet, some valentines and your name card–GEOFFREY. We carried out a bag full of memories instead of a son.

So many things remind me of you, Geoff, of all the things you and I will never do together. I guess that is the most painful thing of all.
