"Professional Image: How Successful People Recognize Each Other" is the topic of an all day nursing conference on Tuesday, September 13, 1988, in the Dana Center.

During the past two years the keynote speaker, Kit Stahler-Miller, RN, MSN, has addressed over 15,000 nurses nationwide on professional images and career development. Her seminars have been conducted to enhance morale, image, and professionalism for personnel in health care facilities, educational institutions, and professional associations.

Stahler-Miller, former assistant professor of nursing at La Salle University in Philadelphia, PA., is founder and president of *Images in Transition, Inc.*, of Palmyra, N.J. The firm provides consulting services to people in all walks of life to enhance image and self esteem.

This conference is an opportunity for nurses to learn how to translate the changes, choices, and challenges facing nursing today into actions that can positively influence career and profession.

Harris named Director of Pulmonary Medicine




