Committee working on child care options

Finding adequate child care is an ongoing concern for many MMC employees. In an effort to address this need, Personnel has taken a three-fold approach including the use of a referral agency, tax advantages for employees, and the formation of a Child Care Committee.

During the past three years more than 1,000 MMC employees have been helped by Child Care Connections, a resource and referral agency that gives advice and guidance on possible child care providers in the community. Contact with the agency is made through the Employee Benefits Office.

An Employee Pre-Tax Program was initiated in January that enables employees to use pre-tax income to pay for child care expenses. Handled through a payroll deduction account, the program has the effect of lowering the employee's tax liability.

In February a Child Care Committee, consisting of 25 employees from a cross-section of departments, was formed to look at the various options available to meet employee's child care needs. According to Chairman Don Sedenka, Em-

ployee Benefits Manager, the needs of MMC employees are varied and unique. Because of the nature of work hours, child care is needed for all three shifts including weekends.

Sedenka says the Committee will attempt to meet the needs of most employees by exploring all possible alternatives. The Committee is researching what others have done, and examining child care legislation. It has looked into the child care solutions of most major organizations in the Portland area, including the three major hospitals in the state. In addition, the Committee is discussing alternatives ranging from a child care center to a network of day care homes.

Don Sedenka will be leaving MMC in April, and Lynn Breckinridge will take over as chair of the Committee. The Committee hopes to present its report and recommendations to senior management by the end of May.




Working For Your Good Health


Medical laboratory professionals at Maine Medical Center along with their colleagues across the nation are celebrating National Medical Laboratory Week, April 10–16.
