Blood Bank provides outpatient treatment

(Part two of a two-part article on MMC's Blood Bank, part of a continuing series on the Laboratories.)

The Blood Bank Therapy Room provides treatment crucial to the well-being of many outpatients at Maine Medical Center. Patients requiring treatment are given the opportunity to obtain the treatment without an overnight hospital admission. These patients range from 2 to 90 years of age. Most have malignancies including leukemia, lymphoma, and other cancers. Many other patients have significant medical disorders requiring replacement therapy such as those with hemophilia and hypogammaglobulinemia. Transfusions, infusions, and chemotherapy are just some of the procedures performed.

Oncology patients, the majority of the patients treated in this unit, receive chemotherapy. This is the treatment of chemical substances used to destroy tumor cells. The drug is administered through an IV and is carefully monitored.

The transfusion of blood products are regularly performed in the therapy room. Some patients with hematologic disorders must receive red blood cell transfusions for anemia. Other clotting dificiencies are treated with a transfusion of platelet concentrates.

It usually takes a two to four hours for a patient to receive a blood transfusion in the therapy room. An IV is started and the patients receive one unit of blood or other blood products at a time. The patient is carefully observed to ensure no adverse reactions occur. Soon after a transfusion is completed, the patient can leave.

Therapeutic Pheresis, the removal of a component from the blood and the reinfusion of the remaining components, is also conducted in the therapy room.

Blood is spun in a centrifuge to separate components into layers of red cells, white cells, platelets, and plasma. The undesirable component is removed by therapeutic pheresis.

Patients are given infusions in the therapy room for a number of reasons, including certain infections and low level gammaglobulin.

The Blood Bank Therapy Room makes it possible for patients to obtain treatment in a matter of hours and leave soon after.
