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TPA tests at MMC aid heart attack victims

In the early stages of heart attacks, in the majority of cases, blood clots are forming, blocking arteries and often proving fatal. In recent years, researchers have developed and tested drugs which, if administered in time, can dissolve such clots, producing both immediate and far-ranging positive results.


Now Maine Medical Center is one of 25 hospitals nationwide actively engaged in treating heart attack victims with TPA, a new drug believed to be the best found for unclogging blocked arteries in the early stages of an attack.

The drug has proven effective for 80% of patients with blocked arteries, and that

degree of success has led to an aggressive final testing phase, according to Costas T. Lambrew, M.D., Director of MMC's Cardiac Intensive Care Unit.

"The treatment worked so well in preliminary tests started last August that researchers at the National Institute of Health (NIH) felt that they could no longer ethically withhold it from patients. They decided last March to eliminate the double-blind type of test (in which a control group of patients would not be given the drug) in the final phase," Dr. Lambrew said.

Maine Medical Center was invited to join the final test phase following a national competition in which quality of care, experience of staff, the ability to carry out a detailed treatment program,






and patient resources were key qualifying factors. The testing, planned to continue for eighteen months under NIH direction, will include some 4,000 patients nationwide.

The testing, under the chairmanship of Eugene Braunwald, M.D., Chairman of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, has become known as the TIMI study. TIMI is shorthand Thrombolysis (clotdissolving therapy) In Myocardial Infarction (heart attack).


Effective treatment requires the awareness of the general public, emergency medical personnel, and other hospitals as well as the staff and facilities of the investigating hospital. The clot-dissolving drug (Tissue-type Pasminogen Activator--TPA) must be administered within four to six hours of the onset of a heart attack. That makes early arrival at the investigating hospital essental.

"When you know that clotting is the cause of the heart attack, it is logical to try to abort the process," says Dr. Lambrew, who is principal investigator for the TIMI study at MMC. "Once the attack begins, there is a time window in which the heart muscle is dying." Dr. Lambrew says that timely administration of the TIMI, page 3

drug can accomplish several things: 1) it decreases the acute MI death rate, 2) it decreases the incidents of arrest in the acute phase, 3) it decreases the occurences of heart failure, and 4) it preserves a substantial amount of heart muscle function, thereby reducing chances of chronic disability.

"When we can stop the clotting process the patient is left with less disability, and the possibility of recurrent attacks is substantially reduced. We need to get the patient early," Dr. Lambrew says, "to start the proper sequence of interventions. The clock on the TIMI study starts with the patient's caregiver at the onset of symptoms."

Patients eligible to receive TPA who are not brought to MMC initially may be transferred by another hospital. Whether or not TPA may eventually be administered in other local hospitals will be determined as the TIMI study progresses, but patients may still need to be transferred to MMC for continued treatment and follow-up care. The development of standards of care is part of the TIMI study. "We know the drug works," Dr. Lambrew says. "What we are now concerned with is setting down the protocols for its administration. The study will give us definitive answers and we will be helping to write the standards of care."

The TIMI study team at MMC, in addition to Dr. Lambrew as principal investigator, includes 12 coinvestigators--Warren D. Alpern, M.D., Richard A. Anderson, M.D., D. Joshua Cutler, M.D., John P.
