Lights to control parking ramp entry

Within the week, a new method of alerting drivers entering the parking ramp to traffic patterns will be in full operation. A set of red/green lights will be mounted on the concrete overhang over the parking booths at the Gilman Street entrance, indicating which traffic lanes are open.

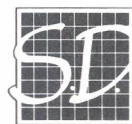
The lights will alert drivers early enough so they can avoid trying to enter lanes that have been designated as exits only during peak traffic periods. The system of designating some lanes as payroll deduction exits during those times has eased the traffic back-ups, but a few close calls have made it clear that people entering the ramp need more adequate warning.

College and the University of Vermont College of Medicine. He served his internship at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, completed his Ob/Gyn residency at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, and did further postgraduate work in oncology, also at the National Naval Medical Center. Certified by the American Board of Obstetrics/Gynecology in 1963, Dr. Boyce was certified by the same board in gynecological oncology in 1974.

Dr. Boyce was for 11 years professor of Ob/Gyn at Wayne State University in Detroit, and served as chief of Ob/Gyn at Wayne State. He then entered private practice in Portland, specializing in obstetrics/gynecology and gynecological oncology, and has been on the medical staffs at MMC and Mercy Hospital since 1978. He has been acting as voluntary, part-time director of the Ob/Gyn oncology service since 1980.

He is a member of the Cumberland County Medical Society, the Maine Medical Association, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and the Society of Gynecological Oncology.
