F. Stephen Larned, M.D. appointed to VPMA post

F. Stephen Larned, M.D., of Portland has been named Vice President for Medical Affairs for Maine Medical Center. The MMC Board of Trustees unanimously approved the appointment at its May meeting. Dr. Larned who is now president of the Medical Staff, will take over the hospital's top clinical administrative post August 1.

MMC President Edward C. Andrews, Jr., M.D., who has also been Acting Vice President for Medical Affairs and served as chairman of the search committee, announced the appointment. "Steve Larned is the right person at the right time for this important post," Dr. Andrews said. "He is a respected physician and effective leader of the Medical Staff. He knows the Medical Center, but will bring a fresh perspective to the office of Vice President for Medical Affairs. We are looking forward to working with him."

Dr. Larned was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan; he graduated from Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts and from the University of Michigan. He received his medical degree from Wayne State University College of Medicine in 1967.

He served his internship and first-year residency on the Tufts Service at Boston City Hospital and completed his medical residency at Georgetown University Hospital. He was certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in 1972 and recertified in 1980.

Dr. Larned worked in MMC's Emergency Department for a year before entering private practice in 1973. He has been an Attending Physician at Maine Medical Center and Mercy Hospital since 1972, and at Jackson Brook Institute since 1984.

LEAVING HOLT HALL ready for its new owners has been a major occupation for MMC's Materials Management Department over recent weeks. Pictured here (from left), Department Director Tom Guare, ODC Supervisor Leo Camire, and temporary helper Michael Hayward remove some of the last hospital items stored in the building. Designed by Portland's pre-eminent architect John Calvin Stevens, Holt Hall was built in 1891 as the Maine Eye and Ear Infirmary. The Infirmary became part of Maine Medical Center in the 1950s, and the building housed MMC programs until 1980; no longer suitable for hospital services, it has since been vacant and used only partially for storage. In 1984, a reuse study on the historically important building was done, financed in part by a grant arranged by Greater Portland Landmarks from the National Trust for Historic Preservation and matching funds from MMC. In 1985 MMC Trustees authorized disposition of the building and sought proposals for its reuse. New owners, Ellsworth Street Associates, will renovate the building for apartment, office, and retail space. Work is scheduled to begin next month for an August 1987 completion. (A/V Photo)

Cancer Conference is set for June 25

Maine Medical Center people are participating in a "Conference on the Cancer Problem in Maine," Wednesday, June 25, at the University of Southern Maine in Gorham. The conference is sponsored by the Maine Department of Human Services and the Maine Cancer Society, to inform health professionals and the public on the nature and extent of the cancer problem in Maine.

MMC Director of Research Peter W. Rand, M.D., will speak on domestic radon exposure, based on work the Research Department has done with the University of Maine and others. Sheila Millington, RD, a registered dietitian at MMC, will speak (representing the Maine Cancer Society) on nutrition and behavior risk factors in cancer prevention. Thomas J. Erwin, M.D., an oncologist on MMC's Medical Staff, will speak on options for cancer treatment.

Other speakers include Gregory F. Bogdan, Dr. P.H., Assistant Director of the Division of Disease Control, DHS, Lani Graham, M.D., M.P.H., Director of the Division of Disease Control, Carl Shy, Ph.D., an Epidemiologist at the University of North Carolina, and Elisha Atkins, M.D., an Occupational Physician from Chelsea, Massachusetts.

The Conference is in Bailey Hall on the Gorham campus of the University of Southern Maine. Registration is \$5.

He served on the Physicians Advisory Board to Community Health Services of Cumberland County, has been team physician for the Maine Mariners hockey club for the past ten years, and is a member of the Portland Journal Club.

Dr. Larned was elected President of the MMC Medical Staff in 1984, an office he resigns this month prior to assuming the Vice President for Medical Affairs position. As president of the Medical Staff he represented MMC's physicians on the hospital's Board of Trustees and the Hospital Medical Staff Section of the American Medical Association.

He has been a member of the MMC Executive Committee since 1982. Also at MMC he has served on the Audit Committee, has been a member and chairman of the Ambulatory Care Committee, and chaired the Health Education Subcommittee of the Ambulatory Care Study Committee. He served on search committees for Emergency Department Chief in 1974, and Vice President for Nursing in 1979. A member of the hospital's Long-Range Planning Committee, he also served on the Physician Fund-Raising Steering Committee for MMC's Capital Campaign.

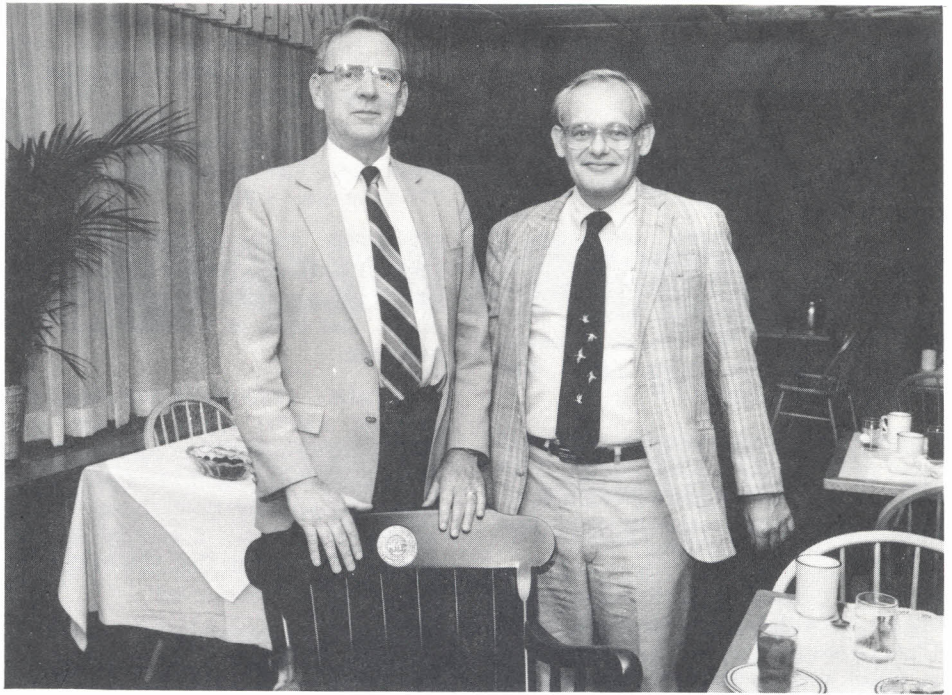

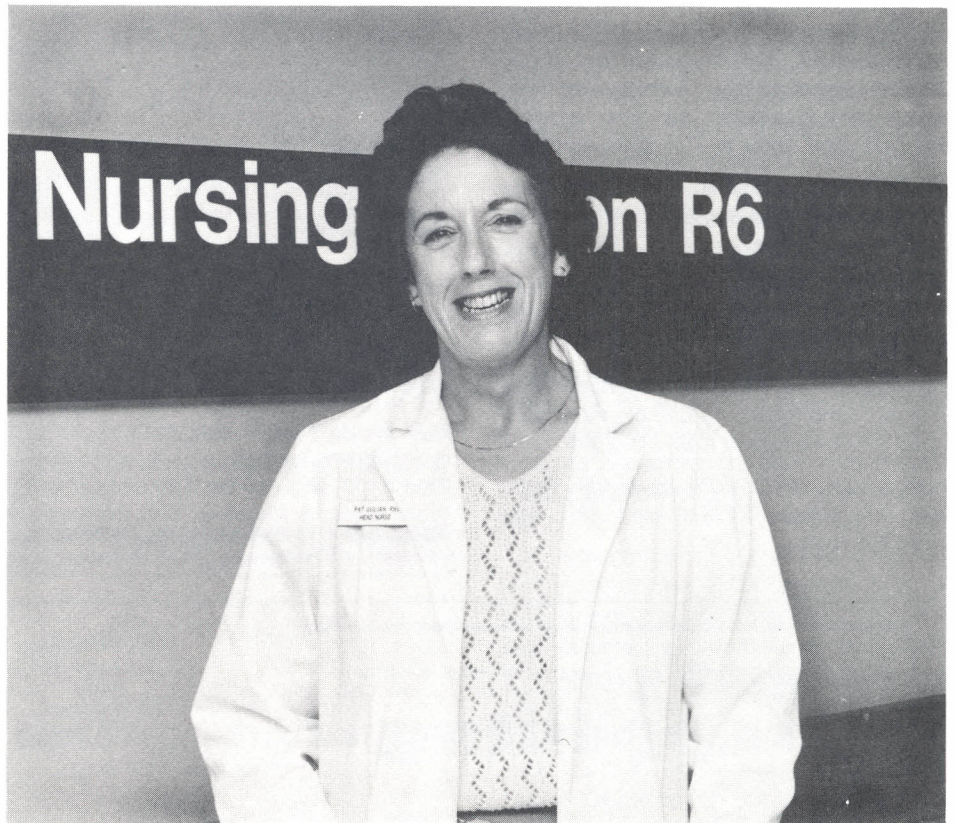
Library shifts to summer times
