




Parking stickers '86 come in blue & yellow

The people in the MMC Parking Office have completed a mountainous task, getting 1986-87 parking stickers printed, recorded, and distributed in time for the start of the new year. The stickers become effective on January 1, 1986.

The stickers---blue for payroll deduction, yellow for daily pay---may be put on cars now, and they will be honored. They must be on by Wednesday, January 1.

As usual, stickers must be placed at the lower left-hand side of the windshield, the driver's side. All outdated stickers should be removed from the windshield. And speaking of windshields, Parking Supervisor Mary Thibodeau asks that all drivers remember to clear snow away from the sticker; it saves parking attendants and parkers a bit of time, especially at peak traffic times.

If additional stickers are needed: employees should stop by the Parking Office, Monday through Friday between 8 AM and 4 PM; members of the Medical Staff, volunteers, and clergy may get additional stickers from their departments; and physicians who park in the physician's parking lot should contact the Parking Office. Anyone with questions may call the Parking Office at ext. 2123.


