Mothers, babies get shaped up together

Sometimes they like it, sometimes they don't, and sometimes they're just not sure, but the babies in the *Shape-Up With Baby* class at MMC certainly know they're involved. The Shape-Up classes are offered as part of the program of Associates for Prepared Childbirth, an educational organization at MMC operated by staff Labor/Delivery Nurse Pam Tozier, RN, BSN. She is a Certified Childbirth Educator, and with several other MMC staff nurses teaches a variety of courses for parents for before, during, and after their baby's birth.


The Shape-Up With Baby class is a five-week program for post-partum mothers. It features special exercises involving both mother and child, to help mother get back into shape and condition baby to movement and fun. Also included are dance routines, games to play with baby, infant stimulation techniques, a mother's talk group, discussion on parenting, baby care and growth, a slide/tape show and guest speaker, and a luncheon party.

"Most of the mothers were in our lamaze classes," Tozier says, "and start the exercise classes when the baby is BABIES, page 3

Recognition Day: Pride in Nursing

Monday, May 6, is National Nurses' Recognition Day, the start of a week-long observation of pride in the profession. It's a pride that can be shared by many in the Maine Medical Center family: by more than 1,000 women and men who work in the Department of Nursing, by all other MMC employees who share the hospital's mission with them, by the thousands of patients who benfit from their skill and care, and by their fellows in the community.

The Department of Nursing plans to mark the week with a special display, soon to appear in the new main corridor. Part of that display will be the announcement of a further nursing recognition event to come: it's a day-long program, set for *Thursday*, *June 6*, dealing with *The Image of the Nurse*. The program,

based on findings after years of research on the image of nursing in the mass media, will be presented by two professors from the University of Michigan, Dr. Beatrice J. Kalisch, Chairperson of the Parent/Child Nursing Department, and Dr. Philip A. Kalisch, Professor of History, Politics and Economics of Nursing. The Kalisches, widely recognized in their field, have been co-investigators in a research project designed to examine the image of professional nurses in the mass media; they express the hope that "study results will provide a basis for current and future efforts to better articulate and present the image of the nurse to the public and to help maximize her/his value to the delivery of health care services."

The program will be presented free of charge to MMC registered nurses --- a NURSING, page 2

The Kalisches' program, much in demand across the country, presents the image of the nurse from many perspectives (historically, currently in news and entertainment media) and suggests strategies to develop a more ideal image for the future. Bringing the program to Portland (to MMC's Charles A. Dana Health Education Center) has required long and careful planning. 

BABIES, from page one ______ four to ten weeks old. It's an opportunity not only to exercise, but for the mothers to socialize as well."

The exercise classes are part of a continuum offered by Tozier and her associates -- Mary Hutchison, McDougall, Cathy Shea, and Andrea Tetreau. The other programs are Lamaze I, a comprehensive prechildbirth education program; Encore, a refresher course on lamaze techniques and update on childbirth methods and policies; Ceasarean, for planned Csection births (special classes for those planning a vaginal birth after a C-section are also available); Pregnancy Fitness, a program to keep expectant mothers flexible, fit, and relaxed; Expectant Grandparents, to bring grandparents up to date on childbirth methods; and a special Siblings program for new brothers- and sisters-to-be.
