Storm policy returns with winter weather

Maine Medical Center has an established policy regarding pay practices during periods of weather severe enough to create difficult conditions for employees traveling to or from work.

Executive Vice President Donald McDowell notes that the policy is intended to help protect the safety of employees as well as to provide continued patient care and safe and efficient hospital operation. "Hospitals must operate at an optimum level regardless of the weather," he says, "and all employees are important to that operation. Therefore, supervisors must exercise discretion in sending employees home. In instances where an employee may be excused and where patient care and hospital operations are not compromised, then that portion of the policy may be exercised.

"The Executive Vice President declares the storm policy in effect," he points out, "but it is the responsibility of the supervisor to make the decision to send employees home early in individual cases."

The policy reads:

- The Executive Vice President will be responsible for declaring the use of the Storm Policy.
- Employees are expected to make every reasonable effort to report to work as usual since patient care requirements continue despite weather conditions.
- Employees who are unable to get to work due to the storm should notify their supervisors as far in advance as possible. When such absences occur, employees may take an excused absence without pay or use accrued vacation or holiday time with approval from their supervisors.
- Employees who arrive late, due to the storm conditions, will be paid for their full regularly-scheduled shift.
- Employees who are sent home, due to storm conditions, by the department head, will be paid for their full regularly-scheduled shift.

Normal MMC pay practices apply to those employees asked to work beyond their scheduled shift to cover for late employees, just as for any other reason.

Pharmacy needs info for computer program

The MMC Pharmacy has brought a new mini-computer system on line, to keep track of outpatient prescriptions and patients. The system will replace a cumbersome card file, and will allow the staff to instantly retrieve patient records. Faster service with fewer questions should be the result.

Anyone holding a "Red Card" and who uses the Pharmacy will be entered into the system eventually. Employees, retirees, volunteers, and patients who wish to save time may pick up an information form at the Pharmacy window at any time. By returning the form early, Pharmacy customers can save a step the next time they pick up a prescription.

With prior departmental approval employees may substitute one other religious holiday for Christmas Day. The Personal Day is a floating holiday which may be used by the employee at any time throughout the year with prior supervisory approval. However, the personal Day may not be used to extend any of the holidays listed above.
