Dana Foundation gives MMC \$1 million

Maine Medical Center's Capital Campaign chairman Vincent B. Welch is announcing receipt of a \$1 million grant from The Dana Foundation of New York City, and a \$300,000 pledge from the Unionmutual Charitable Foundation of Portland -- both in support of the hospital's health education building program.


The Dana Foundation grant, Welch said, is presented as a matching grant for the \$2.2 million education facility. The Unionmutual Charitable Foundation pledge is also earmarked exclusively for construction of the education building.

The building will be named the Charles A. Dana Health Education Center. "We are proud to name the facility in honor of Charles A. Dana who, through the generosity of the Foundation he created, has contributed so much to the quality of health education throughout the Northeast and especially in New England," Welch said. "We are deeply grateful for such substantial support from the Foundation, and we appreciate the wisdom of its trustees in presenting the grant as a challenge to other potential donors."


The State granted MMC a Certificate of Need for the education facility early in June, and a construction start is anticipated in the fall. "Our Board of Trustees has decided we are close enough to receiving full support for the building," said MMC President Edward C. Andrews, Jr., M.D., "and to proceed with plans, and the solicitation of bids."

Shepley Bulfinch Richardson and Abbott, Boston architects who designed the hospital's Phase One building and renovation program currently underway, and Phase One construction managers, McBro of St. Louis, Missouri,

are also working on the education building.

The need for more and better education space has been recognized all along as MMC trustees, staff and consultants have moved through years of planning and into the present building program. But, according to Dr. Andrews, the Board of Trustees early on decided that construction of any education facility should not be financed by debt that would be dependent on patient care fees for its retirement. The Phase One building program now in progress and the education building program were planned separately, received approvals on separate Certificate of Need applications, and are being treated as separate fund-raising challenges.

"To say our education space is grossly inadequate would be an understatement," said Dr. Andrews. "Maine Medical Center is the major teaching hospital in Maine and the only one that has residency programs in all the major clinical disciplines, yet compared with other hospitals in the State with significantly smaller education requirements and commitments, we are alarmingly lacking in education space."

The new Charles A. Dana Health Education Center has been planned as a two-story structure that will fit atop the existing NDF building. It will accommodate seating for more than 650 people (compared with MMC's present limit of 288). This will be arranged with a combination of classrooms and conference rooms with capacities ranging from 10 to 50 to 100 people, and an auditorium seating 250. With attendant lobby and reception, housekeeping, storage, audio/visual, and other support areas, the facility will total about 19,400 square feet.



The summer blood donor is a rare bird. Be one. Friday, July 22, 7:00 AM - 5:00 PM, Classrooms 3 & 4

The Red Cross is experiencing its annual summer blood donor shortage, and this year the shortage is earlier than usual and more severe. Collections have been dropping, and this makes Friday's blood drive at MMC more important than ever.

Blood usage is increasing in Maine and throughout the United States. At MMC alone, over 3,500 units of blood and blood products may be administered in a given month. All that blood can come from only one place -- volunteer donors.

You can be one of the irreplaceable and the elite -- the volunteer blood donors -- if you want to donate and if you're eligible. In general, you may donate blood if you 1) are in good health, 2) have never had viral hepatitis, 3) weigh at least 110 pounds, and 4) have not donated blood in the past 8 weeks (56 days).

Age is not a factor, if you are between 17 and 65. Under 17, parental permission is required, over 59, you must have donated before, and over 65, physician's consent is required.

If you have ever had a heart attack, stroke, epilepsy (most forms), or diabetes requiring insulin injections, you should not donate for your own safety.

If you are pregnant, you should wait until 6 weeks after full-term delivery to donate, and 6 months after major surgery, again for your own safety.

For the safety of those who will receive the blood, the Red Cross will defer you permanently if you have had hepatitis or cancer, and temporarily if you have recently had malaria, exposure to viral hepatitis, a blood transfusion, or certain injections. The Red Cross is also asking those in the high risk groups for Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) or who have AIDS to not donate blood.

The rising problem of AIDS is causing problems for blood collection centers nationwide. Some cases of the disease have been tenuously linked to blood transfusions, so many people are afraid to donate, thinking they could contract the disease by donating. The Red Cross points out that "It is impossible to get AIDS from donating blood... it cannot be transmitted by the sterile, nonreuseable, and safe needles of blood bags or by Red Cross personnel... this is one of the few things about AIDS of which we are absolutely certain."

If you're not sure about your eligibility, why not drop in and find out? The worst that can happen is a deferral, and even with that you still get a heartfelt "thank you."
