October is Energy Conservation Month, and the Maine Office of Energy Resources is asking employers throughout the state to remind their employees about carpooling. The MMC Carpool Project is still available for interested employees, and applications for the Greater Portland Rideshare program are available as well.

The MMC Carpool Project offers employees a way to make connections with other employees who also wish to carpool. It is entirely a hand-matched system, so personal needs can be taken into account. Applications are available at the Public Information Office (x2196).

The Greater Portland Rideshare program is being operated by the Greater Portland Council of Governments, under a grant from the Office of Energy Resources. Applications for this program, which draws on interested people from other places as well as MMC, are also available from the Public Information office. These are to be returned directly to the Greater Portland Council of Governments, which will provide a list of potential ridesharers.

Those who have submitted applications to either program and have not heard back should not despair. All applications are kept in the active file unless and until the applicant requests otherwise. If you have not heard, it is because there is no match yet. If you wish, the Public Information office can place a "Ride Wanted" ad in What's Happening for you, which may bring a response. The Portland newspapers also have a "Car Pools" section in their Classified Ads.

For those in the service area, the METRO may be the best alternative to the personal automobile. Route and scheduling information for the buses is available by calling the METRO at 774-0351.


Kjeldgaard named head of Pulmonary Division

MMC Chief of Medicine Robert S. Hillman, M.D., has announced the appointment of J. Mark Kjeldgaard, M.D., as Medical Director of the Division of Pulmonary Medicine. Dr. Kjeldgaard takes over from Edgar Caldwell, M.D., who is on educational leave to study pulmonary hypertension at the University of Texas in Dallas.

Dr. Kjeldgaard says clinical research is one area the Division has wanted to explore more fully for some time. He says Dr. Caldwell will return to MMC in April as Physician Coordinator for Clinical Research, enabling the Pulmonary Medicine Division to actively pursue research activities. Dr. Caldwell will also practice as an attending physician.

Designed to provide family and general practice physicians with an insight into behavioral difficulties that may present in their practices, the daylong conference features faculty from MMC and other New England institutions

MMC-Mercy Chief of Family Practice John Randall, M.D.C.M., will open the conference with an overview. David V. Sheehan, M.D., Chief of the Psychosomatic Clinic at Massachusetts General Hospital, will discuss "The Phobic Patient." Elisabeth Keller, M.D., Clinical Assistant in Medicine at Childrens' Hospital Medical Center in Boston and Clinical Instructor at Harvard Medical School, will discuss "Office Recognition of Early Disruption in Parent-Child Interaction."

Terrance Riley, M.D., of the Boston University School of Medicine, will talk about "Insomnia." Director of the Division of Child Psychiatry of the MMC Psychiatry Department G. Adair Heath, M.D., will discuss "Adolescent Depression." "Atypical Depression" is the topic for MMC Department of Psychiatry Training Director George McNeil, M.D., and C. Lewis Ravaris, M.D., Ph.D., Medical Director of the Brattleboro Retreat in Brattleboro, Vermont, will discuss "Psychopharmacologic Agents."

I recently had the experience of visiting the Ambulatory Surgical Unit the Maine Medical Center for a day. I underwent some minor surgery which required general anesthesia.

My purpose in writing this letter is to give commendation to the nurses and other staff members at MMC (of which there must have been at least two dozen that served me). I found them to be very devoted, professional, efficient and unafraid of hard and ceaseless work. Furthermore, they seemed to have the comfort of myself and the other patients around me as their primary concern. It is my understanding that the MMC is now operating at its maximum capacity, and yet, these nurses and other staff members did not in any way make the patients feel uncomfortable by acting harried and over-worked.

I have had only two other hospital experiences, both of which were many years ago, however, are vivid in my memory. I felt as though I needed to constantly apologize for my existence and that I was just an unwanted problem for the nurses. Even when I would be in dire distress, I never dared to ring "the bell" for fear I would be admonished. During this visit to MMC I never had the need to ring "the bell", however, I knew that I was welcome to do so and that I would have received a prompt and cheery response.

I cannot single out any names, for, without exception, each of the MMC nurses and staff members with whom I came in contact were exceptional people!

I hope that if these nurses and staff members are too busy to be able to read this letter, that friends and relatives will share it with them.
