

HONOR NIGHT, from page one-Medical Association, brought greetings not only from physicians on MMC's staff but from "those across the state, who feel very comfortable in referring a patient to Maine Medical." He reminisced about some of the employees, no longer with us, who had made a great impression on him when he had done his residency here 21 years ago. Dr. McAfee then assumed his role as Doctor of Comedy and Chief of Satire, delighting the assembly with irreverent character analyses of the hospital's administrators. When the laughter died, however, he again praised every employee in every department at MMC, thanking them for the "heritage they have created." To those young employees who have their careers ahead of them, he said "do what you will with what we call Maine Medical Center. but above all, preserve it."

Employee Larry Johnson, Engineering Services, turned the tables on Drs. Andrews and McAfee, with a glowing report from an employee's perspective.
