Christmas sale scheduled Nov. 19-Dec. 1

The annual Christmas Sale of the Women's Board of Maine General Hospital will be held Nov. 19 — Dec. 1 in the MMC admitting lobby, offering a larger-than-usual selection of holiday gifts, decorations and specialties.

In a departure from past years, the sale will run continuously for two weeks from 9 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.. Saturday hours are from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.; there will be a 5 p.m. closing the night before Thanksgiving, and the sale will be closed on the holiday itself.

Chairman of the sale is Mrs. James Flaker of Cumberland with Mrs. Wallace Camp of Cape Elizabeth as co-chairman. They have been assisted in the planning by members of the Women's Board and other friends of the hospital who will serve as the sales staff as well.

Mrs. Flaker says a sale feature will be an extensive collection of stuffed toys and animals, many of them life-size. There will be a Christmas tree with many unusual ornaments—metal, glass, crystal and even wood—and peppermint spice ropes as well.

Gifts will include mugs, casseroles, brasses, unbreakable glasses and trays. There'll be Oriental items, she says, and candles, table lamps and many other useful and attractive housewares.

Mrs. Flaker said the proceeds will help the Women's Board honor its commitment of more than \$50,000 to the Cancer Radiation Treatment Fund which will be devoted to the purchase and installation of the new 20 MeV linear accelerator.

During that same period he was a visiting lecturer to the University of Maine School of Law.

With the degree of M.D. from the University of Vermont College of Medicine and the degree of J.D. from the University of Maine School of Law, Dr. Bonney is active in organizations representing both medicine and law. He was admitted to Maine Bar Association in 1967; is a Fellow in the American College of Legal Medicine; and holds memberships in the American, Maine, and County Bar and Medical Associations. He is also a member of Law and Medicine Committee of the American Bar Association and serves on the Committee on Medico-Legal Research and Teaching of the American College of Legal Medicine.

"Generally," Ms. Williams said this week, "the discussions are designed to show most of us how we can use our money with better leverage.


The discussion leaders include two MMC department heads, Charles R. Dibble, director of Materials, and Peter C. Barnard, director of Development.
