## QUOTA FILLED AGAIN

MMC's 1975-76 quota of 17 interns has been filled under the national system that matches the preferences of both candidates and teaching hospitals. A second aortic balloon pump has been presented to MMC by a man and woman from Kennebunk Beach in memory of their respective spouses. The gift, by Edward Hodgkins and Mrs. Ruth White, is in memory of Mrs. Ruth Hodgkins, who died in 1973, and Fernald R. White, Sr., who died last year. The hospital's first aortic balloon pump was given by Mr. and Mrs. Hodgkins in 1973.

The balloon is placed in the aorta by cardiac surgeons, and by inflating and deflating, increases the circulation in the heart itself, and relieves its workload.
