## 6TH SURGICAL SYMPOSIUM

Francis D. Moore, M.D., Mosely Professor of Surgery, Harvard Medical School, will deliver the Isaac M. Webber Surgical Lecture at the Sixth Annual Surgical Symposium at MMC March 7-8. The Webber Lecture will be a highlight of a program that will open Friday morning, March 7, and continue through 1 p.m. Saturday, March 8. Friday events are under sponsorship of the MMC Department of Surgery and the Saturday program is sponsored by the Maine Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. A total of 25 MMC staff members are Symposium participants, along with Loring W. Pratt, M.D. of Waterville; Don L. Maunz, M.D., of Bangor and John Root, M.D., of Rockland. An evening program which will include a reception, dinner and presentations, has been scheduled Friday at the Ramada Inn. Ferris S. Ray, M.D., Robert E. McAfee, M.D., and Richard C. Britton, M.D., chief of Surgery, are members of the planning committee.
