MEETING METRICS

MMC received a publication last week that lists at least 13 reasons for American hospitals to adopt the metric system, and urges that health care institutions—already partly on metrics—lead the way for the rest of United States industry. Here are some of the reasons: It's the preferred system of measure in science and medicine worldwide; all new drugs are expressed in metric units; a single measurement system will eliminate a source of errors; calculations are easier; all medical formularies use only the metric system.

The book recommends that the metric system be learned by itself, without reference or comparison to other systems. Don't try, in other words, to convert Fahrenheit to Celsius...just remember that water freezes at 0° Celsius, boils at 100° Celsius, and that the normal body temperature is 37° Celsius. More on metrics later.
