Hugh C. Saunders, president of the board of trustees, has expressed his thanks for the efforts of all MMC people to promote budget savings and counteract the effects of recession and inflation. In a letter to Philip K. Reiman, executive director, Saunders wrote: "I know it has not been an easy process, but at a time when many who use our hospital find themselves out of work, out of savings and out of insurance, and many others find themselves living on drastically reduced incomes, it was important that we do what we could to minimize the financial impact without reducing the quality of patient care.

"The review of our priorities in no way signals retrenchment. On the contrary, such a review is periodically essential to protect our resources and enable us to move steadily forward in the pursuit of excellence."

THE BEGINNINGS OF MIS

Clint Cooper, MMC's MIS coordinator, told department heads Thursday that work is progressing well on R8, and that the new computer--brain of the system--will arrive May 15. He said electrical workers will begin running cables from the R8 computer room to nursing stations and other areas of the hospital this week. Cooper said three video matrix terminals have been set up in the old laboratory area, operating on leased telephone circuits from St. Barnabas Hospital in Fairfield, N.J., where Technicon has just completed a MIS installation. Interested individuals or employee groups will be welcome but are asked to make appointments.

Five nurses were named Friday as members of a MIS implementation team that will function from Monday to just before Christmas. The five are Eric Anderson, R.N., Dayle Moulton, R.N., Dorothy LaMarre, R.N., Sandra Bell, R.N., and Marlene Moulen, LPN.

They will be involved in altering and adapting video matrix displays used in other $\underline{\text{MIS}}$ hospitals for use in MMC, and in training nursing personnel to use the system.
