#### TO MEET A SUMMER NEED

To increase inventories and to prepare for emergencies, arrangements have been made for a Regional Blood Bank technician to draw donors in the MMC Blood Bank on a regular basis, Monday thru Friday from 1 to 4 p.m. It is hoped that not only hospital people will help with blood donations, but also that patients' relatives will be donors, and that the convenience of the daily drawing at MMC will increase donations. ## ADVANCE VACATION CHECKS

Requests to pick up either regular or vacation checks earlier than Friday must still be made by the department head, in writing, to Mike Kilmartin, controller.
