DR. ELKINS NAMED

Alan M. Elkins, M.D., chief of Psychiatry and Director of MMC's Community Mental Health Center, was named this week as a member of the prestigious National Advisory Council, U.S. Department of Health and Welfare. The appointment was announced late Thursday by Rep. Peter N. Kyros, who called Elkins "one of the most dynamic and promising young men on the health scene in Maine today." In an interview with Press Herald Staffer Mike Scanlin, Dr. Elkins said he felt the appointment reflected MMC's reputation rather than his own.
