PARKING FOR PATIENTS

Administrative Engineer Donald W. Bail announced Thursday, in a letter to department heads, that the small parking lot at the Admitting Lobby will be reserved as of Monday, January 3, for the cars of patients who are being admitted or discharged. Drivers will receive a ticket as they enter, and admitting personnel will attach a sticker to the ticket which will give the driver up to two hours' free parking. A small number of spaces will be available in this lot for visitors and others, but these drivers will be charged 25¢ hourly. Other parking lot operations are NOT affected by this change.
